Barry Kaufmann is a retired teacher who taught in Poughkeepsie for thirty-four years. After many years of union-related positions in his school district and in NYSUT, he was elected President of NYSARA in 2015. As President, he is committed to keeping all retirees informed about the policy and voting issues affecting their daily lives.

At RC 21's June luncheon, Barry spoke about the attacks on Social Security and Medicare. He emphasized that while some people are calling SS an entitlement, it really is an earned benefit paid for throughout our careers. He pointed out that the same people in power who would sell America to corporations are also using their influence to restrict the vote, to pit one group against another, to push for

individual savings accounts instead of Social Security, to use means testing for SS benefits, and to push for a voucher program to privatize Medicare.

Those who would repeal SS promote the myth that the system is going bankrupt soon and are pitting the young against the retirees. The truth about the financial status of SS is that if Congress does nothing legislatively, *(Continued on page 2)*

(*From page 1 Awards Luncheon*) the SS system will be able to pay 100% of benefits through 2034 and 75% of benefits thereafter. One common-sense solution to help make the fund stronger is to set the cap for wages on which FICA is collected at \$300,000. As to Medicare, allowing the program to negotiate drug prices, which is prohibited now, could save the system \$140 billion over ten years. One of the reasons for the extraordinarily high prices of drugs is the ability of drug companies to re-patent drugs by making minor changes in dosage, ingredients or shape, something allowed by the TPP. Remedial actions on these issues could reduce the costs of programs that are now under attack.

Barry urges us to be active members of NYSARA. This organization works for all retirees, not just unionized people. He asked that we remain vigilant and spread the information we receive through NYSARA to our fellow retirees.



Rosemary Catanzariti, the Director of ED 52, spoke briefly about the importance of voting against the referendum on the Constitutional Convention which will appear on the ballot in November 2017. Remember that the Constitution currently protects our pensions. It is not necessary to open the entire body in order to make changes. Changes can be made by amendment, if necessary.

We were reminded about the October 6th Legislative Conference by Joan Perini. This is a joint Suffolk and Nassau event where we can hear our representatives in government speak to our issues. 


