Dennis Tracey, President of NYSARA, spoke to the lack of confidence citizens have in the Government at this time. The continuing resolutions used to fund the government for short time spans has been the norm since the last budget passed

in 1997, under President Clinton. Mr. Tracey warned that we must take the offensive and we need one voice to unite people to work on four areas of concern.:

- Reforming the economy by raising taxes on the wealthy.
- Working towards creating jobs with an eye towards

education and infrastructure.

- Creating a just economy with upward mobility for all citizens.
- Protecting Medicare, Medicaid and Social Security from attacks in the guise of reform.

He said the White House must make "tough choices" in the following months to fend off attacks on Social Security such as means testing while making promised "investments" in the future of our economy. We must hold our local, state, and federal representatives responsible. We can do this by staying informed and acting on the information individually or collec-
